Zero Tolerance Policy Document

Introduction: Zero tolerance policies are a strict approach to maintaining peace and discipline within

Policy and procedures:

• Violence and Aggression: Any form of physical violence, including assault, or bullying will not

be tolerated in the college.

• Harassment and Intimidation: Harassment, intimidation, or stalking that makes others

uncomfortable is not acceptable in the college.

Discrimination behavior: Discriminatory behavior or hate speech targeting individuals or groups

based on their race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or disability is a punishable

offense in the college.

• Drug abuse: Engaging in illegal activities like drugs or drug trafficking is a crime, and legal

action will be taken against those found involved.

• Sexual harassment: Gender discrimination and sexual harassment are a punishable offense on

campus.

Property Damage and Theft: Vandalism, destruction of property, and theft are behavior that

undermines the safety and well-being of the community and are not acceptable on the campus.

• **Disruptive behavior:** Disruptive behavior that interferes with the peace and functioning of the

college community is a punishable offense.

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
